Seminar/Workshop sessions on TP2 and TP3 work to date also available and also benchmarking presentation. It is suggested rather than formal presentations on Tuning we should look to create Workshops where the pilot can be discussed and we can explain how to apply to their own countries.

Aim of this event will be to publish first results of the pilot and launch the full survey. Also look at Europeanisation of geography and database exchanges and opportunities.

By using the competencies we should make something specifically European, perhaps a module? This would be a good time to present a proposal and also comment on the future of our group.

In looking at a specific European module for geographers who wish to have a European aspect to their training we should invite universities and call for papers from universities, which would like to present their European profile. This could also make an interesting publication.
