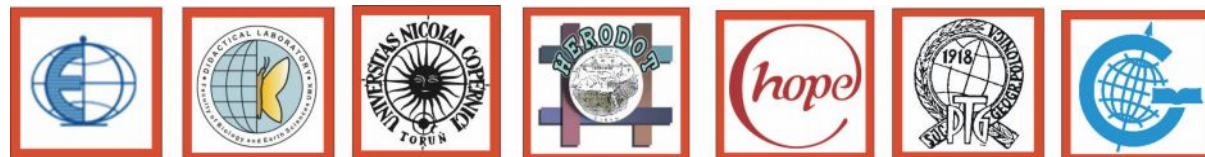
- European Network of Geography Teacher Associations

- Help set up new national and regional associations





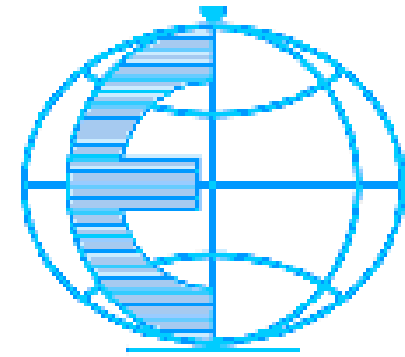
HERODOT

- Many spin-off projects happening

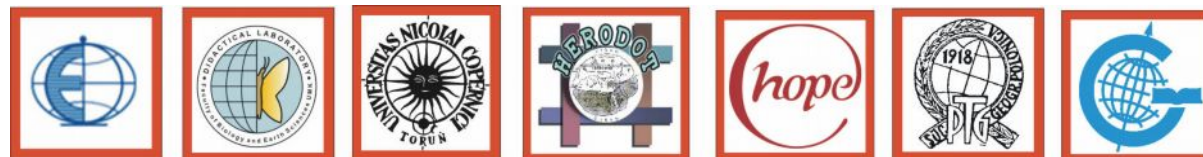

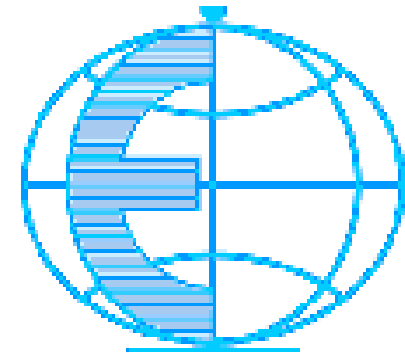

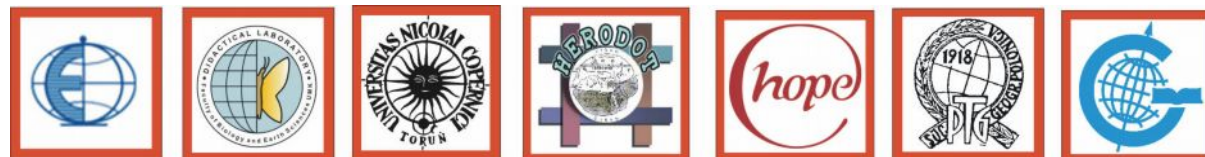


Conference Aims



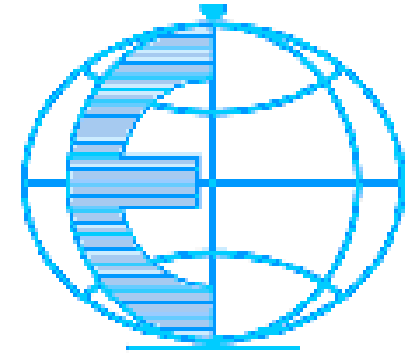
Changing Horizons in Geography Education seeks to:

- find ways to further promote Geography



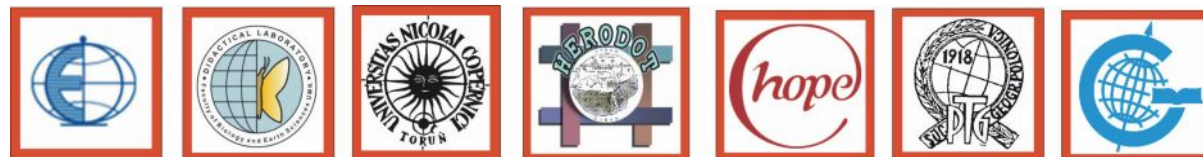

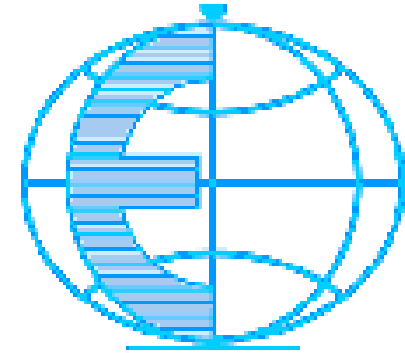
Four main themes:
