## First Announcement and Call for Papers

With this announcement the Organising Committee is pleased to invite the specialists in Geography and Geographical Education to participate in the International Conference to be held in Toru•, Poland, 2-5 of September 2005.

The event will consist of two parts: the Conference *sensu stricto*, (presentations and workshops) and a field trip.

### **Preliminary Program**

The program of the Conference will include plenary and 3 parallel sessions:

- 1<sup>st</sup> session Intercultural aspects in Geographical education
- 2<sup>nd</sup> session Professional development and Geography
- 3<sup>rd</sup> session Exciting Geography

Each session will include oral presentations, poster session and discussion, a workshops may also be organised.

The Field Trip programme will be announced later.

The volume of Conference proceedings will be published before the meeting.

We strongly encourage the cooperation of Herodot members to participate in the preparation of papers.

### Language

The language of the conference is English. No translation of the presentations will be possible.

The registration will include a copy of conference materials, breakfasts, lunches and dinners, accomodation on September, 2nd, 3rd and 4th and Field Trip. Financial support for the members of the HERODOT network will be provided based on submitted publications.

### Registration and call for papers

The initial registration form should be submitted not later than **20<sup>th</sup> February 2005** together with theme of

poster or oral presentation. The other important dates include:

- **Submission of full-text** – **May, 15th, 2005**
- **Final registration, fees payment** – **June, 15th, 2005**

Papers should be sent in an electronic form only to the e-mail address [pecha@geo.uni.torun.pl](mailto:pecha@geo.uni.torun.pl). The file should have the name of the author. The paper should not extend over 5 A4 pages (including references).

General requirements are the following:

- G MS Word for Windows,
- G Title in capitals, bold, 12 point,
- G The name(s) of the author(s) in the form "family name and initials", in 12 point, bold,
- G Affiliation with a complete postal address, 12 point, in italics,
- G If affiliations of the co-authors are not the same, they should be listed in succession.
- G The e-mail address of the corresponding author, 10 point, in italics.
- G Abstract and key words, 10 point
- G Main text: Font Times New Roman 12 point, 1.5 spacing, tabulation 0.5 cm
- G Tables and figures should be inserted directly in the Word file.
